The Development Manager reports to the General Director, and works closely with senior staff to provide the management and coordination of all the Company's contributed income, including individual, foundation, corporate, and government giving, planned gifts, major gifts, and special campaign fundraising, as well as special events. The Development Manager plays a central role in identifying, cultivating and soliciting major donors.

Responsibilities

- Manage Annual Giving
- Secure sponsorships for the annual Gala
- Generate revenue to meet the Company's contributed income goals
- Primary responsibility for individual and corporate giving; oversee program for other sources of contributed income (board, foundation, government)
- Be a key member of the team that stewards relationships with principal donors
- Identify and solicit corporate gift and partnership opportunities.
- Oversee the production and execution of development collateral materials
- Manage the Patron Program
- Develop and execute strategies for retaining and upgrading base level and new donor giving.
 Primary point of contact for donors, which entails responding promptly to inquiries and acknowledging gifts.
- Oversee database management and maintenance to ensure that donor records are accurate and up to date.
- Oversee coordination of fundraising events and additional events in support of fundraising.
- Continuously monitor results versus benchmarks and deadlines.
- Work closely with the development committee of the board.
